



Why the Blackfeet Indian Reservation & Browning, Montana?



De La Salle Blackfeet School

 Annual family income is \$15,000 with a population of about 2500 in Browning, Mt.

- ✤ 80% unemployment
- Industry: Firefighting
- Sub-par Public School System
- Strong Roman Catholic presence in the community



Where is Browning Montana?

- Located just east of
 Glacier National Park
- ✤ 3 Hours south of Calgary
- 2 Hours Northwest of Great Falls
- Rocky Mountains rise in the west, while the east look onto the Great Plains

- Simple kitchen, bathroom, showers and community space
- Separate sleeping quarters for males and females
- All in our group share in the cooking and cleaning chores

- Each day begins with morning prayer and each day ends with evening prayer
- Thursday and Sunday Mass
- Several opportunities to learn about the various injustices surrounding life of an Indian Reservation




What About Safety?
