#### Tony's Fight on the Court - 11/19

In 2016, Tony Even '98, was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma stage 3ES. The first Tony's Fight on the Court fundraiser was organized by Tony's family and friends to help alleviate the burden of his medical bills. The event was a success, and after undergoing many treatments, Tony is now cancer free. In appreciation, Tony and his family wanted to continue the event, but pass the proceeds on to help other deserving families dealing with a major illness like cancer. This year's proceeds will benefit the Welter family. Sam Welter, age 9, was diagnosed with a form of viral meningitis in late August. He spent weeks at Cincinnati Children's in the PICU, where he had to be intubated and sedated until his medical team was able to reduce the swelling on his brain. Thankfully, Sam overcame the life-threatening virus and was discharged from the hospital recently, but will undergo therapy. A portion of the proceeds will also go to the Make-A-Wish Foundation, the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and a scholarship endowment at La Salle High School. - · All students are expected to arrive at school on time Friday, Monday, and Tuesday and are expected to report to the exam bells accordingly.
- During exam bells, students are to be engaged in instructional activities for the duration of the bell, and students who finish their exam early are to remain in the classroom for the entire block of time to minimize hallway disruptions.
- Students may leave school at the conclusion of an exam bell if that is their last exam of the day.
- The cafeteria will not be open for lunch on exam days, but the cafeteria staff will be offering grab-and-go items for students.

Students enrolled in the following courses do **not** need to report for exams:

Finally, students who miss an exam are expected to make alternative arrangements with their teacher to make it up either Monday, December 19 or Tuesday, December 20.

#### **College-Level Examination Program - CLEP**

We are excited to offer the opportunity for students to earn college credit through the CLEP test. During the 2021-22 academic year, high schools administered 39.5 thousand CLEP® exams to their students, helping them earn 99.7 thousand credits and saving them approximately \$35 million in tuition costs. Steve Schulten will be offering La Salle students enrolled in Sociology and American Government the opportunity to prepare for taking a CLEP test this spring for college credit.

#### **Key CLEP Facts**

- Students can take exams at any time. CLEP has no class requirements or set testing dates
- CLEP offers 34 exam subjects, including Biology, College Algebra, History of the United States II, and more
- Students can prepare using affordable online study resources and knowledge gained from advanced or honors coursework.
- CLEP exams let you test out of introductory courses and move to more advanced courses sooner, saving time toward your degree.
- CLEP is accepted by approximately 2,900 U.S. colleges and universities.

We plan to offer more CLEP opportunities at La Salle during the 2023- 2024 school year! More information to follow when we begin the course scheduling process (during the 3rd quarter of this school year).


