Weather communication for Thursday morning



Catholic Schools Week - 1/31 - 2/4

We have been celebrating Catholic Schools week all week! Be sure and check social media for pictures of our students and staff dressed in different themes each day. We will continue our school-wide service project, collecting personal care items for St. Vincent de Paul and our annual penny wars, donating monies raised to the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. Students are encouraged to bring in toiletry items to donate and coins for the penny wars. So far, students have donated \$1,506.60 and 1,004 in personal care items through Wednesday. Items will be collected each morning in the courtyard lobby from 7:00 - 7:55 am. Due to student donations, we have earned the day off for Super Bowl Monday, February 14, 2022! Freshmen are lacking in Lancer Day Games participation, students can sign-up outside of room 311. If school is closed due to weather, donations will still be accepted on Monday and Tuesday.

If your student chooses not to participate in the theme day, he must be in his regular La Salle uniform. Students not dressed for the theme day or in their regular La Salle uniform will receive a referral for a dress code violation. Thursday's theme of shirt and tie is NOT optional, as students and staff will participate in Mass and appropriate attire is required. Students who dress in the theme earn a point for their class to add to their class totals at the end of the week, they need to check in with the senior leaders in the morning in the courtyard entrance to earn points.

ACT Prep Course

On Tuesday, March 15, 2022, La Salle juniors will be taking an official, state-funded ACT provided through the State of Ohio in conjunction with the ACT organization. The results of this test can be submitted with students' college applications in their senior year. Students may choose to take additional ACT tests outside of the March 16 date. Students will need to pay the \$60 registration fee for any additional tests. The \$60 fee for the test is without the writing/essay portion, which most universities do not require.

Though it is never required for testing, La Salle is offering an ACT Prep Course prior to the March 15 ACT. Test preparation is no different than any other skill: the more the student intently learns and practices, the better the student should become. Our approach involves testing, skills review, problem-solving concepts and strategies and practice materials.

The course will consist of six sessions from 3:15 - 5:45 pm on Tuesday afternoons:

- February 8
- February 15
- February 22
- March 1
- March 8

Please note the date and time changes for the sessions as well as the test dates. These sessions are intended to prepare the students for the ACT on March 15, 2022, as well as for future ACTs. The course cost is \$385 which includes the textbook. Registration information for the course is available. As of February 1, 2022, the fee is still \$385 but will not include the textbook. Questions or concerns, please contact Kathy Moroney. Students who have previously taken the course are reminded that they may attend all or some of the sessions with no additional fees.

BDK Fund scholarship applications - due by 2/28

Newly-accepted and returning high school students are eligible to apply for The BDK Scholars Program with scholarships starting at \$1000. 

COVID-19 new guidelines

New guidance from the Ohio Department of Health and the Hamilton County Public Health Department brings new changes to our COVID-19 policy yet again. Under the new guidance, all positive cases are still to be reported to school and in turn, we will report them to the HCPH

Each case will be traced at school and a student's individual teachers (whose classes are affected by the case) will be notified by the nurse. In turn, those teachers will notify the students in a particular bell, that a case of COVID-19 was reported in their class.

If a student has a home or social exposure, they will follow the Mask to Stay/Test to Play policy.

If your son knows he was exposed through school or a school-related activity, please call the nurse for instruction on the Mask to Stay/Test to Play Policy.
