

RIOTING IN BRAZIL: WHAT WENT DOWN

Among many political conflicts and rioting stretching the world around, Brazil decided to throw its hat in the ring last month as well.

On January 8, 2023, supporters of former president Jair Bolsonaro stormed Brasilia, breaking into the Congress building, Supreme Court, and presidential palace, causing damage, as well as spraying messages in acts of vandalism. Bolsonaro, inaugurated in 2019, was a member of the Socialist Liberal Party, which he turned conservative. Current president Lula de Silva, a liberal, was inaugurated on December 31, 2022, less than two weeks before the insurrection.

Many of the onlookers have been quick to point out that security in the capital was surprisingly lax on January 8, especially considering some officials claimed that they were expecting some form of uprising. In fact, many were shocked by the incredible lack of force used against the protesters. Overall, it has been said that the changing of leadership among military forces in the capital led to such a laid back approach to the protesters. Former Federal District Security Chief Anderson Torres has been arrested on charges of terrorist attacks and planning a coup. To date, 39 have been arrested and accused on the same charges. Additionally, multiple law enforcement offices have been fired since, with no specific reason stated.

All in all, January 8 proved to be another lesson in the importance of the police force and other law enforcement. And although the protesting has since died down, this event will remain prevalent in the minds of the people who witnessed it.
