### 2016-2017 School Profile

La Salle High School was part of a large expansion program of secondary schools of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Archbishop Carl J. Alter of Cincinnati asked the Christian Brothers of the St. Louis Province to establish and staff the new school. Groundbreaking for La Salle High School was on March 1, 1959 with the first graduating class occurring in 1964. La Salle High School, accredited by Ohio Catholic Schools Accrediting Association, member of NCEA, and a Lasallian education institution affiliated with the Midwest District of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, is a selective, college preparatory high school primarily serving the north and west areas of Cincinnati, OH with approximately 675 young men in grades nine through twelve. The majority of the students come from Catholic grade schools with others from public and private junior high and middle schools. The school operates on a four day block rotation consisting of six classes ranging from 50 to 80 minutes per day.

#### Graduation Requirements

A minimum of 60 Christian service hours is required outside of regular school hours. **For the class of 2017**, a total of twenty-eight and one-quarter credits (28.25) are required for graduation. **For the classes of 2018, 2019, and 2020**, a total of twenty-five (25) credits are required for graduation, including the following:

#### Weighted GPA Scale:

For weighted GPA calculations, College Board AP and College Credit Plus courses are based on a 5.0 scale; Honors courses are based on a 4.5 scale; and all other courses with numerical grades are based on the 4.0 scale.

#### Grade Indications

A = 90 – 100% indicates outstanding work.  
 B = 83 – 89% indicates above average work.  
 C = 75 – 82% indicates average work.

D = 70 – 74% indicates below average and unsatisfactory academic work.  
 F = <70% is considered a failing grade, and indicates that the student does less work than the minimum required in class

## Academic Programs and Course Levels

**Lasallian Scholars Institute (LSI):** LSI is a four-year program designed to challenge high-performing students. Students will experience extensive career and college pathway exposure through experiential, company-sponsored and college-facilitated learning. LSI adds to the rigorous academics of its students and connects their academic learning to their futures. LSI students directly interact with business professionals in high-growth industries such as Informational Technology and Management, Healthcare, Global Business, and Engineering through a specialized curriculum of nearly 200 business-led seminars including field visits, project management, and real-world challenges and presentations to business professionals.

**Student Support Services Program:** This program provides specialized support as well as a smaller student-teacher ratio for students with gaps in their educational background and/or documented educational disabilities with the goal for the students to obtain the skills necessary to be successful in college.

**De La Salle Signum Fidei Institute (DLSFI):** The De La Salle Signum Fidei Institute is an innovative leadership development program. It is at the center of student life as it is webbed in the curriculum, student activities, athletics, and campus ministry. DLSFI focuses on the five pillars: Faith, Community, Service, Leadership, and Scholarship and challenges each student both in and out of class to grow into a servant leader.

**Honors and Advanced Placement (HP & AP):** Rigorous courses, some of which are Advanced Placement courses or college-credit courses. These courses are designed for students who excel greatly and pursue the highest achievement of academic success. The following AP courses are offered at La Salle: *English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, U.S. Government and Politics, U.S. History, Human Geography, Physics (Mechanics), Chemistry, Biology, Spanish Language, French Language, Latin, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics.*

**Advanced College Preparatory (ACP):** Accelerated courses aimed to prepare students to excel in college.

**College Preparatory (CP):** Courses geared to provide students with the skills necessary for collegiate success. Within the College Preparatory academic level, there are two internally designated classifications: CP1 and CP2.

**General:** Courses which prioritize general core content (e.g. some non-leveled courses, physical education, non-high school remedial courses).
